Dear First Name,

Earlier this spring, in the wake of the outbreak of the coronavirus, Congress passed and President Trump signed into law the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act. This very complex piece of legislation included provisions intended to assist various sectors of the United States economy impacted by the pandemic.

One portion of the CARES Act is the Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund (HEERF). This Fund within the CARES Act was included to provide direct emergency aid grants to students whose lives have been disrupted by the pandemic, many of whom are facing financial challenges and struggling to make ends meet, for expenses related to the disruption of campus operations due to coronavirus (including food, housing, course materials, technology, health care, and child care).

Rosemont College moved quickly to enter an application for its allotment of the Emergency Relief Fund on behalf of its eligible students. That allotment has now been made available to Rosemont for distribution. At Rosemont College, the process for distributing these grants parallels the process already in place for the disbursement of federal financial aid for higher education to ensure that the students with the most demonstrated financial need will receive it.


As a Rosemont College student who is eligible to receive the Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund, you are receiving the enclosed check in accord with the Fund's guidelines.

The amount of the enclosed check was calculated using your individual eligibility for Pell Grant funds based upon your most recently filed FAFSFA at Rosemont College.
